#### **School Development Days**

The year commenced for teachers and education assistants with two School Development Days on 31<sup>st</sup> January and 1<sup>st</sup> February. Staff attended professional learning on the following areas; Willetton Primary School Induction, Technology, STEAM & Science, Coding, English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) and Guided Reading.

#### Cluster 2

During the school holidays work began on the refurbishment of Cluster 2. The roof, ceiling and toilets have been replaced, carpeting and painting throughout was completed and benches and shelving will be installed by 25 February. Stage 2 will be re-tiling and replacing the sinks and benches in both wet areas, followed by Stage 3 developing a teacher's resource room.

#### Congratulations

On behalf of the Willetton Primary staff and students I wish to congratulate our Science Specialist, Mr Joshua Jardine for his successful application to the Australian Government Department of Industry, Innovation and Science, for the Federal Maker Projects Grant for STEM spaces. Schools across Australia presented applications in a process that was full within an hour of opening. Maker Projects aims to foster creativity and inquiry based learning in Australian schools and communities through the establishment of maker spaces in schools where students can apply their STEM knowledge, develop entrepreneurial skills, and gain experience in working with emerging and advancing technologies.

Joshua's application was successful which means Willetton Primary will receive the maximum grant of \$5000 to support the establishment of a maker space for students to access and work on STEM-related activities

# THE WALLETTON WORKSHOP

#### Willetton Workshop 2019

Welcome back everyone to another exciting and busy year at Willetton Primary School where it is full STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) ahead! As many of you would no doubt already know, last year the school placed an emphasis on STEAM, particularly coding and robotics, by introducing specialist STEAM lessons for years 1 & 2, Coding Clubs for year P-1 & 3-4 students and, investing a significant amount of resources into technology including additional iPads and robots.

In 2019, STEAM will continue to be a priority area and will be supported by a dedicated STEAM workshop located in the former music room. Thanks to a successful grant application at the end of 2018, the Department of Science & Innovation will provide the school with \$5000 to establish a brand-new makerspace. This grant money will be used to purchase several 3D printers, mobile steel benches, tools and consumables for students to explore design and construction. All classes from Pre-Primary to Year 6 will be rostered on for one one-hour session in the workshop per week as part of their classroom and Science curriculum.

A special thank you must go to our amazing gardeners Mr S and Mr Sweeney, Miss Patching and Miss Patching's mother, Mrs Hughes' son Will and Mrs Ravlich's sons Cade and Zac for the countless hours they have spent stripping the room, cleaning and painting to have it ready for everyone to use. Please make sure to keep an eye on the workshop this term as it begins to take shape and classes start to utilises this fantastic makerspace.
