Languages week 2019

Last week was *Languages Week* run by the Office of Multicultural Interests. Mrs Long ran a survey with the children at WPS to see how many languages (other than English) are spoken at WPS. It was fascinating to see how many children were bilingual or some even trilingual! We discovered the following fun facts!

- There are **more than 7,000** distinct languages spoken around the world according to the 2017 Ethnologue language database.
- In the 2016 census, there were over 300 separately identified languages spoken in Australian homes.
- At WPS 33 different languages are spoken daily at home!
- In one class at WPS nearly 50% of children were bilingual and in another just 15%!
- Some of the less common languages spoken by students at WPS are Pidgin (Papua New Guinea), Kannada (South West India), Shona (Zimbabwe), Setswana (Botswana), Dzongkha (Bhutan).
- The most common languages spoken at WPS are Mandarin (China), Hindi (India), Malayalam (Kerala, India), Cantonese (Southern China & Hong Kong), Korean (South Korea).
