# Message from the Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

### **Public School Review**

All government schools are now reviewed usually every three years. The review process provides assurance to the Minister, Director General and our school community about the performance of Willetton Primary School. The Public School Review is founded on how effectively we create and sustain the conditions for student success through:

- · engaging relationships and partnerships
- a positive learning environment
- effective leadership
- quality teaching
- use of resources
- analysis of student achievement and progress

The first part of the School Review is to make judgements about our own performance and identify aspects of effectiveness and areas for improvement. Two reviewers will be visiting Willetton Primary School on Thursday 17 October. This external validation adds value to our school's judgement about our performance and provides additional feedback to support our plan for our continued improvement.

## **Sport at Willetton**

Many of our students have been involved with cross country running, basketball and netball over the past couple of weeks. Some students have, or will, participate in all three events. Our school hosted the Interschool Cross Country event on Wednesday 21 August at Piney Lakes Reserve. Our cross country team of 40 competitors came third overall. We took 50 boys and girls to the Willetton Basketball Cup, with teams placing 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> in most events. And, this Friday 30 August, for the first time, Willetton have 36 girls competing at the State Netball Centre in the Multicultural Netball Cup.

Playing a sport helps children develop social skills which benefit them even when they grow older. Playing sports teaches them about teamwork and cooperating with others. The opportunity to develop more friendship circles helps improve their communication skills, which will help them in their future careers and relationships.

### **Science Week**

We are all very excited about the Scitech Space Dome being in our school all of next week to National Science Week. Every student from K-6 will spend a half hour in the dome and half hour attending a space workshop with the Scitech team.

## **Edu Dance**




# **P&C News**

### Would you taste some lamb for \$1,000?

We have an easy and tasty way of making \$1,000 for the school, all we need is 60 people to give up an hour of their time to taste test Aussie Lamb.

The Meat Standards Australia (MSA) research program has been running for 20 years and has conducted over 150,000 consumer sensory tests to contribute data to initially develop and then continually strengthen the MSA eating quality prediction model for beef and lamb eating quality which underpins the MSA grading system.

This event is free and easy and yum! You don't need to bring anything – just your hungry tummies and your tastebuds! There are 3 sessions of 20 people each. Each session goes for 1 hour where you will taste 7 beef or lamb samples and complete a questionnaire in response.

The P&C are investigating whether this is something we could do as a fundraiser. If we have sufficient responses then we will coordinate a date and time with Murdoch University and contact those interested to participate. You must be 18+ to volunteer your time.
