## Message from the Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

### 16 DAYS IN WA

Violence against women is a fundamental violation of human rights, and a serious issue on a global, national and local scale.

In Western Australia, the 16 Days in WA to Stop Violence Against Women campaign, led by the Hon Simone McGurk MLA, Minister for Prevention for Family and Domestic Violence, was developed by the Department of Communities to take action to end violence against women and raise issues that impact them. It brings the global 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence campaign to a local stage.

A primary focus of the campaign in 2019 is the engagement of young people to promote a future where relationships, families and communities are respectful and safe.

As part of the campaign, a short film is being created to promote our key message 'Speak out to stop violence against women' among young people and the wider community.

The film will feature Minister McGurk with WA activists and advocates who will encourage the community to 'speak out' when it comes to gendered violence.

Willetton Primary School students in years 3-6 have been invited to be a part of this very important initiative. Drone footage of students in their school uniform, standing in a large outline of the number '16' will be included in the 'Speak Out' short film.

To facilitate this, a drone crew and representatives from the Department of Communities will visit the school next Friday between 9-10am to photograph the Year 3-6 students forming the number 16 on the school oval.

Students will be bringing home an information form and permission slip today. Further information about the 16 Days in WA Stop Violence Against Women campaign can be found in the information pack located in the Connect Library under '2019'.

### PUBLIC SCHOOL REVIEW

All Western Australian public schools are reviewed every three years by the Department of Education's Public School Accountability directorate. A review gives assurance to the local community, the Minister for Education and Training and the Director General that a school is operating effectively and delivering high quality education to its students. The review acknowledges the achievements of the school and gives feedback to support the principal and staff with their improvement planning.

The principal provides the review team with a self-assessment of the school's performance based on evidence gathered by the Principal and staff. Information validated by the review team is considered before and during the school visit. This forms the basis for the school review report. The report is provided to the Principal, the Chair of the School Board and the Regional Executive Director.

# Message from the Deputies

## Department of Education Mobile Phone Policy Update

Last week, the State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy to take effect from the start of Term 1, 2020.

The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on aeroplane mode during this period. The policy aims to reduce distractions in class and improve student engagement.

In the policy, primary students cannot have a mobile phone in their possession. This means if your child brings a mobile phone to school, it will be stored until the end of the school day. Exceptions are allowed for students who have approval from me to use a phone to monitor health conditions.

If your child needs to contact you, they can do so through the school administration. Likewise, if you need to get a message to your child, you can call the school.

Earlier this year, the school introduced a new mobile phone policy discouraging students from bringing such devices to school. Whilst this policy may need minor revisions in light of these new Departmental guidelines, as a school we currently have no issue with mobile phone use and are delighted with our students' responsible use of such devices when necessary.

## NAPLAN Results 2019

Results for the 2019 NAPLAN testing have been released and I am delighted to announce that Willetton Primary School has performed well above expectations in most areas.

The tables below outline the performance of our Year 3 & 5 students against what the Department of Education considers our 'Like Schools'. These schools are determined based on our Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA) which takes into consideration: our parents' occupations, education and geographical location. Any area shaded green indicates the school has performed more than one standard deviation above 'Like Schools', an outstanding achievement!

I would like to take this opportunity to commend the entire school staff for these excellent achievements. In particular, the work that has gone into preparing our students for NAPLAN Online testing this year. Every class across the school has spent time developing the ICT capabilities of students (particularly by making iPad use a daily feature in classes) and word processing skills. Feedback from a range of schools has highlighted how well the school has handled the transition to Online testing. A special thanks must go to Desley Spencer-James and Sharne Elsbury for their tireless work in ensuring the testing ran smoothly.

Staff have been analysing the NAPLAN results in detail and will use this information to inform our planning for 2020.

There are a number of committee members and P&C members moving on at the end of year so we'd love to see lots of new faces!



- The **PRESIDENT (Executive)** chairs all General and Executive Committee Meetings of the Association and offers leadership and management of the committee. Works with Secretary on meeting agendas.
- The **VICE-PRESIDENT (Executive)** assists the President, represents the P&C at WACSSO meetings (~1 per term), and chairs meetings when President is absent.
- The **SECRETARY (Executive)** takes care of correspondence and administration documents, takes meeting minutes, maintains a register of members, and notifies the school and WACSSO of the office bearers and committee members before 30 April. Works with President on reporting to the ACNC and Associations Online.
- The **TREASURER (Executive)** is responsible for all monies (receipts, payments, banking, and related documents), provides statement of accounts to each P&C meeting, maintains proper books of accounts and prepares annual financial statements for audit (end December), and forwards a copy of the audited annual financial statements to the school and WACSSO.
- The **FUNDRAISING CO-ORDINATOR** co-ordinates P&C fundraising projects and event teams.
- The **UNIFORM CO-ORDINATOR** liaises with uniform shop, manages the school dress sales, co-ordinates graduation shirt ordering with school, and co-ordinates the second -hand uniform collection & sales. This has been a shared role.
- The **SAFETY HOUSE CO-ORDINATOR** co-ordinates the safety houses in the area and the Safety House activities.
- The **SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE** co-ordinates sustainability initiatives and liaises with the school on more sustainable approaches.
- The **KPP LIAISON** co-ordinates Kindy and Pre-Primary events and activities with KPP class reps.
- The **SCHOOL BANKING CO-ORDINATOR** co-ordinates volunteers for school banking and banks student monies.
- The **CANTEEN SUB-COMMITTEE** is a team of parents that oversee the canteen. This committee requires a convener and a treasurer and at least 2 other members, and works with the canteen manager, assistant and volunteers on ensuring a sustainable canteen that serves healthy, delicious food for students and staff.
- The **PR TEAM** work to co-ordinate news and information to school and general community through school newsletter and website, notices to families, P&C notice board, P&C Facebook page and other avenues.

The P&C needs at a minimum 4 office bearers (a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer) plus 3 other executive members to run and a minimum of 10 financial members at meetings to vote on things. However, many hands make light work and are much more fun.
