Our Vision, Purpose and Values

Our vision, purpose statement and values outline the ethos and culture of the school, highlighting high expectations of student achievement tied to effective and well researched teaching and learning programs and practices. These are displayed around the school and in every classroom.

Duty of Care Before and After School

Parents have the duty of care for students travelling to and from school. This means it is the parent's responsibility to ensure their child arrives safely to and from school. Absences will be followed up by a letter if no reason is given for the absence.

Schools are responsible for duty of care of students once in the school grounds during school operating hours. As teachers are preparing for the day and not available for duty supervision, at our school, children are asked to come to school from 8:30am when classrooms are opened by the teachers. If children come to school prior to 8:30am, Year 1-6 students are asked to sit on the benches in the undercover area until they are permitted to enter classrooms and prepare for the day at 8:30am.

In Kindy and Pre-primary children are to be handed over to the care of a staff member, and not to enter the Kindy or Pre-primary classroom without an accompanying adult.

Students participating in before school activities are asked to go straight to the teachers in charge of the activity and will be dismissed from there to go to classrooms at 8:30am.

After school, it is expected that children make their way home straight away unless under the supervision of parents, for example playing in the Nature Play (Parklands), or junior primary sandpit play areas.

Immunisation reminder from the Community Nurse

The West Australian Immunisation Schedule recommends that children who have turned 4 years of age have the following booster immunisations:

- DTPa-IPV (vaccine against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough) and polio)
- All other WA schedule vaccinations recommended, completed including MMRx2 (measles, mumps, rubella)

Your child should have these immunisations as soon as they have turned 4.

At school enrolment, the parent/guardian is required to provide the immunisation status of their child. The only acceptable documentation for this purpose is the **child's Immunisation History Statement** from the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). The date of the statement should be within the two months prior to accelerate.

A child's current AIR Immunisation History Statement can be accessed at any time by the parent/guardian through:

MyGov, by logging into their Medicare online account Medicare Express Plus App, by logging in to the Medicare account Visiting a Medicare or Centrelink office, or

Calling the AIR General Enquiries Line on 1800 653 809 for the Statement to be posted.

Overseas immunisation records must not be accepted directly and must be verified by an Australian immunisation provider.

PLAYGROUP WA PLAYCONNECT AND POSSIBILITIES

Playgroup WA (PGWA) assists families with children with additional needs to consider a community group, a PlayConnect or supported playgroup, or to enjoy a combination. The 4 PlayConnect ASD groups each has a facilitator and resources and support through PGWA. Families can also gain information from PGWA about local community playgroups affiliated across WA, intergenerational groups, and education playgroups supported in schools (ETTS).

Playgroup WA PlayConnect facilitated playgroups

Playgroup WA offers 4 groups specifically for families who have children awaiting assessment or have a diagnosis for ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder). Or who have similar early communication needs or developmental delay. PlayConnect playgroups are free and are part of the Australian Government funded HCWA Helping Children with Autism Package. Please ask PlayConnect Coordinator for information about HCWA in 2019.

LOCATIONS Please contact Playgroup WA office for details.

EAST/SOUTH PlayConnect Forrestfield playgroup Families attend from local suburbs and council areas such as Belmont, Kalamunda/Hills, Gosnells, Armadale, Canning and more.

SOUTH METRO PlayConnect South Lake playgroup Families attend from areas in Cockburn, Willetton & Canning, south to Baldivis and on. And Fremantle and closer to the city, Melville.

NORTH METRO/COASTAL PlayConnect Whitford playgroup This location attracts families from throughout the Northern corridor. Including families who travel from coastal areas north to Yanchep and Alkimos.

CENTRAL/NORTH EAST PlayConnect Westminster playgroup. New location 2019. From Term One our central group moves to the Child and Parent Centre, CPC Westminster. The group involves families from any central and inner suburbs and into the north east. Including families towards Ellenbrook/ Bullsbrook.

ABOUT PLAYCONNECT ASD friendly playgroups

PlayConnect playgroups welcome families with children aged from birth to 6 years with needs related to Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), including similar communication or developmental needs. Including families in the very early days when awaiting appointments and the possibility of receiving an ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder) or other diagnosis.

No referral is required but please ask families to contact Playgroup WA Office in advance so we can plan with the local group facilitator for your visit to a PlayConnect playgroup.

Siblings are welcome. And the involvement of siblings means our groups have children of all abilities

Playgroup WA PlayConnect playgroups are free. Morning session of 2 hours weekly x 1 per week.

PlayConnect groups run during school terms.

Playgroup WA provides an experienced and skilled facilitator with the playgroups. Families let the facilitator know if there's zomething specific that they want to hear about in the group. Or what they hope (including therapy recommendations) their child/children might try at playgroup. And areas their child will enjoy. The groups are often smaller and children can practice and learn new skills in a friendly environment.

The playgroup is a great opportunity for families to connect with others and share in interesting and relevant play experiences. The peer support element is very strong, Families comment that they and their children feel relaxed in the observoup setting, they do well, and have FUN!

We use the playgroup model, PlayConnect is definitely a playgroup, not a therapy group.

Flexibility-some families participate on a fortnightly basis due to therapy/life/kindy commitments

Enrolling families -complete a one page enrolment form (and for insurance), similar format as Playgroup WA affiliated groups. Families share in the benefits of being part of a WA wide association.

Common Signs

Parking prohibitions are imposed to regulate and modify parking patterns. Their main function is to ensure that potential vehicle/pedestrian conflicts are eliminated.



No Stopping You must not stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping sign



You may stop in a No Parking zone for a maximum of 2 minutes to drop off or pick up passengers. You must stay within 3 metres of your car at all times.



Parking Signs
Parking signs with specified time limits allow drivers to park their vehicles only within certain time periods.



Bus Zone

You must not stop or park in a bus zone.
