## Message from the Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Thank you for your attendance at the parent information sessions over the past fortnight. Your commitment to such opportunities to connect and communicate in our on-going partnership in your child's education is vital.

#### **School Development Day**

Reminder to all parents and carers that Friday 28 February is a Pupil Free Day.

There is unequivocal evidence that the quality of teaching is the critical school variable in raising student outcomes. Schools where teachers work collaboratively have also been shown to deliver improved student outcomes, provided they focus on understanding and using student achievement data and examining the impact of different teaching strategies on student progress.

School Development Days are allocated to all WA Public Schools for the purpose of providing professional learning and support for staff. School support is strongest where there is a culture where staff are valued, treated with respect, trusted, have opportunities to collaborate, and grow their professional capabilities. The whole school will be off-site on Friday 28 February to attend professional learning together. #### Restructure of Kindergarten and Pre-primary Classes

Ensuring every student is on a pathway to success begins with providing high quality development and learning experiences for students in their first years of school.

The wellbeing and educational achievement of students in the early years must therefore be a priority. For our school that means taking a close look at what is happening for children in the first years of school and seeing where improvements can be made in class sizes.

Due to the high student numbers enrolled in the two Pre-primary classes at such an early stage of the year, it is necessary to reduce these numbers by restructuring the configuration of early childhood classes.

All possibilities have been carefully considered and investigated in the best needs of the students. All decisions are made in the best interests of the school and our students to ensure we provide every student with the best possible opportunities, and teaching and learning environment to ensure they reach their full potential.

#### What is a P&C?

P&C stands for parents and citizens, which means anyone reading this newsletter!

P&C Associations are an officially recognised forum where anyone over the age of 18 who is interested in the welfare of government schools can meet to discuss educational issues. The objects of an association are to promote the interests of the school for which it is formed through:

- (a) cooperation between parents, teachers, students and members of the general community;
- (b) assisting in the provision of resources, facilities and amenities for the school or schools; and
- (c) the fostering of community interest in educational matters.

School Education Act 1999, part 3, division 8, subdivision 2, section 143 (1).

P&Cs give parents and other members an opportunity to learn about the school's policies and programs; organise ways in which parents can share in shaping and developing school policies; bring parents together to share information and views; assist the school in building positive attitudes to students and their families; help raise funds to provide extra resources (reference).

Yes, this means that P&C are important enough to be included in the Education Act of the WA Parliament! It also means that we are about more than just fundraising. We're passionate about making our school community a happy, inclusive and safe environment, because that's how our kids learn best. ## Message from the Community Health Nurse

#### **Community Health nurses in Primary school**

Welcome back to the school year! My name is Sharon Madlener and I am the community health nurse for your school in 2020. I work within a team of community nurses and we visit all primary schools in the Canning Region throughout the year.

Community nurses work with schools to promote healthy development and wellbeing so students may reach their full potential. A major part of our work is focused on early intervention and the School Entry Health Assessment program.

We also serve as a health contact point for children and their families, providing information, assessment, health counselling and referral. The services provided are free and confidential.

# Community Health Nurses working with primary schools

#### Who are the Community Health Nurses?

School Health Services are delivered in public and private primary schools and district high schools across Western Australia. The Community Health Nurses who deliver the services, are employed by WA Country Health Services or Child and Adolescent Health Service (in metropolitan Perth). Teams of Community Health Nurses provide services in local primary schools.

#### Community Health Services in Primary Schools

Community Health Nurses are primarily involved in early detection of health concerns and promotion of health and wellbeing for children and their families. They may provide;

- Information, advocacy and support for children and their parents to make informed decisions about health, wellbeing and development.
- Health and development assessments.
- · Referral to other health services for further assessment, diagnosis, treatment or therapy.
- Parenting advice and parenting programs (eg Triple P).
- · Support for teachers to provide health education in the classroom.
- Support for student health and wellbeing programs (eg healthy eating).
- Support for school health promotion initiatives.
- Facilitation of professional development for teachers to ensure schools can care for children with particular health needs, e.g., asthma or anaphylaxis.
- Assistance for school staff and parents to develop health care plans for students with special needs (eg chronic disease; physical disability or other complex health conditions).

A School Level Agreement is negotiated between the School Health Nurse and/or the Nurse Manager and the Principal to guide service delivery at individual schools.

#### As a general rule Community Health Nurses

- Do not provide minor first aid (the school is responsible for this).
- Do not administer medication.
- Do not conduct invasive physical examinations.
- Do not conduct checks for head lice.
- · Do not undertake long term interventions about psychological, relationship or educational problems.

## **School Entry Health Assessments**

Community Health Nurses endeavour to conduct a **School Entry Health Assessment (SEHA)** for every child during the first year of school – usually kindergarten. This universal screening program aims to detect problems with hearing, vision, oral health, growth, development, and any other health and wellbeing issues which are of concern for parents or teachers. These assessments are usually conducted within school hours and require parent/caregiver consent.

Activity	Details	Timeframe
Information gathering	A health assessment form is sent to parents (via the school) to provide information about the SEHA, seek their consent to conduct the assessments, collect relevant health history and provides an opportunity to identify concerns	Term 1
Prioritising	Community Health Nurses review parental responses from the health assessment forms and regularly liaise with teachers to appropriately prioritise children.	Term 1-3
Assessment	Screening tests are not comprehensive assessments, but highlight issues which may need further assessment and/or treatment. The tests are non-invasive and quickly applied. They include  Vision screening  Hearing and ear health screening  Body Mass Index (BMI) including height and weight  Oral health  Developmental screening includes a 'first level screen' using a parent and teacher observations.  Nurses communicate results with parents and work with them to provide information and support and link them to other health providers, as required.	Term 2-4
Follow-up and liaison	Community Health Nurses liaise with parents to empower, support and follow-up with care and referral if required. With parent consent, Community Health Nurses liaise with teachers and school staff on matters of child health, development and wellbeing.	Ongoing
Referrals	Community Health Nurses refer clients to a range of providers for further assessment and treatment, most commonly to general practitioners and child development services. With parent consent, referrals can be done collaboratively with the classroom teacher.	Ongoing

Registrations are online at MyNetball.com.au and close on 1st March 2020.




