## Message from the Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

## **Harmony Day**

Harmony Day is a day that celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. It is an Australian government program that centres on the message that 'Everyone belongs', reinforcing the importance of inclusiveness to all Australians. To celebrate Harmony Day this year, we will commence the day with a cultural costume parade at 8:50am. This will be followed by an Incursion for Years 2-6 and class rotations of Harmony Day activities. At 1:00pm there will be a special Family Picnic. I am unfortunately unable to attend these celebrations as I will be attending a STEM Conference, but I wish all of our parents, friends and students a lovely day of celebration of inclusiveness.

#### **Mathematics Problem Solving**

The Western Australian Curriculum Mathematics learning area covers four proficiencies – Understanding, Fluency, Problem Solving and Reasoning. Our data analysis indicates that Problem Solving is an area where we are not meeting our 2017-2019 Business Plan targets. Staff recently attended Professional Learning with Paul Woodley on Approaches to Mathematics - Problem Solving: Teaching *for* problem solving; Teaching *about* problem solving and; Teaching *through* problem solving.

### **STEM Innovation Partnership Schools**

In Term 1 the Western Australian Department of Education sought expressions of interest for schools to collaborate with existing Innovation Partnership Schools to test and refine practices in STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics)

A huge thank you and congratulations to our Science/STEAM Specialist Mr Joshua Jardine, who's application for Willetton PS was successful. This is an opportunity for schools to benefit from the prototyping developed by other schools, to trial these ambitious new ideas in their own contexts and collaborate on how they can be adapted to scale and have a positive impact on a diverse range of learners. Through participation in the program, we would expect to upskill the whole staff in the assessment of Digital Technologies and other learning areas through STEM projects. We would like to explore ways of utilising project based learning to challenge and extend our high achieving students while fostering a lifelong interest in STEM related subjects and fields. In return, we would hope to share our whole school approach to STEM projects known as 'SPARC' with others and gather feedback to continue to develop and refine the approach. Willetton Primary STEM journey has only recently begun and we are proud of our progress so far. The Innovation Partnership will provide us with the opportunity to share our journey, particularly in the development of our makerspace, the implementation of our before school coding program 'Code Orange' (which has seen nearly 200 students participate since 2018) and the implementation of our BYOD iPad program. I will be joining three of our teachers, Joshua Jardine, Jane Patching and Christy Walmsley, as we attend our first 2-day Conference this week on Thursday 21 & Friday 22nd March.

## **SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!**

Dear Parents,

Our school photo day is coming! Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day every student will receive a Kapture Photography order envelope to bring home. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. If you pay online, there is no need to return the order envelope to school.

Alternatively you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. Please note the photographers cannot open sealed envelopes and cannot provide change.

#### SIBLING ORDERS CAN ONLY BE PLACED ONLINE: Late requests cannot be granted.

You have the option to order a sibling photo package online, however please note <u>sibling orders will close in most instances @midday sharp at least one business day before the first photo date.</u> We suggest you place your online sibling order as soon as you receive your order envelope with your order instructions.

#### Log on to kapture.com.au for your sibling photo order cut-off date and time.

Late payment envelopes cannot be accepted by the school office or by Kapture. You can place an order online for class or individual photographs at any time for the remainder of the current school year however a \$15 fee will apply if you order more than 10 days after photography.

If your child is in a sports or special group photo, you can use the same school code on your order envelope to view and order these photos on Kapture's website, around the time that school photos are ready to be delivered. Please note; Class group, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please direct them to the Kapture office on 9240 1714 or email enquiries@kapture.com.au.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group photo available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.

#### **Healthy eating for families**

In our modern society, very few of us use up enough energy to take on the extra calories of 'treat' food and drinks. The Australian Dietary Guidelines provide up-to-date advice about the amount and kinds of foods and drinks that we need regularly, for health and well-being.

By providing your family with the recommended amounts from the Five Food Groups and limiting the foods that are high in saturated fat, added sugars and added salt, your family will get enough of the nutrients essential for good health, growth and development. A healthy diet reduces the risk of chronic diseases such as heart disease, type 2 diabetes, obesity and some cancers.

The amount of food your child will need from the Five Food Groups depends on their age, gender, height, weight and physical activity levels. For further information go to www.eatforhealth.gov.au



## **Healthy lunchbox ideas**

Your child's lunch box can contain food from all of the five food groups. The food groups are; breads and cereals, fruit, vegetables, meat/meat alternatives and dairy/dairy alternatives.

Try these in the lunchbox:

- 1. lean ham and salad wrap
- 2. banana and handful of grapes
- 3. sliced vegetables (carrots, cucumber, tomatoes)
- 4. handful of reduced fat cheese cubes
- 5. bottle of water

#### Shop smart and eat healthy - tips for parents

**Go shopping with your children** and allow them to choose the healthy foods that they enjoy eating. For example, ask children to choose some of the fruit and vegetables.

Shop twice a week - fresher fruits, vegetables, breads and meats are more likely to appeal to the whole family.

Buy in season - seasonal fruits and vegetables taste great, are better quality and are better value for money.

**Select small pieces of fruit** - younger children prefer smaller pieces of fruit as they are easier to handle.

Choose quality - try to avoid bruised fruit or vegetables.

**Encourage variety** - so that your child does not get bored with their food


