Easy Junior Level – Navena Thangapandian



Answer: 26


3. Marcia Mallow was allowed 2 scoops of ice-cream. She could choose from Vanilla, Mint, Blueberry and Chocolate.

One holds 10, another 12 and the largest 15 (There are only five boxes of each size remaining.)





She has ten dozen Lamingtons to distribute.
