"Well then I'm the idiotic person," says Manas, and flips the box open. The other three scramble to the kitchen and get some plastic utensils as pathetic weaponry.


Out pops a little furry kitty "Mmmrrroooooow!" As the ground shook, the others say "Wut?"

#### CONVICTS

My name is Sarah and I'm nine years old. My mum and dad sadly died from a disease called Cholera so I was sent to an orphanage with sisters. Our master was really cruel. We escaped except our master saw us and yelled, "You're coming to live with me in London, servants!" It was terrible, I didn't like it at all. I had to clean out chamber pots, climb up chimneys and scrub the perfectly clean floor. Three days later, my hair was a bird's nest so I stole the brush and brushed it and I kept the hairbrush. Later my master found out it was stolen. She saw me with it and gave me to the Bow Street Runners. They took me to the Bow Street Court where a cruel Magistrate stood in front of me. He asked, "Do you plead guilty or not guilty?" I sadly murmured, "Guilty." My punishment is seven years transportation. We finally set off for New South Wales on the 13 May 1787. When we left from Portsmouth. I was really thrilled. I'm on board the medium size Lady Penrhyn and there were 166 women or ladies on board. Our boat isn't so old, it is only 1 year old. There were a lot of ferocious storms and bed bugs, rats and mice. It was horrible! At least it was better than England. The food was horrible there was dry salted meat, dried peas, dry bread, rolled oats and sauerkraut. It took over 252 days/8 months. I was really seasick and just normal sick. The boat travelled approximately 24,000 kilometres. Our group arrived at Botany Bay on the 20 January 1788. None of the ships were lost and only 48 people died. We ended up at Sydney Cove and I was petrified but relieved.
