Languages – Indonesian

This year during the week of Hari Kemerdekaan (Indonesian Independence Day), which falls on 17 August, we received a special visit from the Indonesian Consul General, Ibu Listiana Operananta. Staff from the Indonesian Consulate General in Perth facilitated sessions during which the Year 5s and 6s learnt some contemporary Indonesian dances and played the angklung (a traditional musical instrument made of bamboo).

This is what Ibu Listi said about her Q&A session with the Year 6s: "I felt privileged to meet with students, teachers and parents, especially the school Cultural Ambassador, who is a senior student at Willetton Primary School with important responsibilities. I was impressed by students' awareness that learning Bahasa Indonesia is essential not only because we are neighbours but because learning Indonesian bridges the two countries, Indonesia and Australia – and particularly West Australia – with a more profound understanding of each other's cultures and customs. I am so proud and honoured that their Bahasa Indonesia teachers emphasise the importance of communication and connecting through language. Some of the questions expressed by students during our interaction were very mature and critical. Their genuine interest and enthusiasm is a breath of fresh air. Thank you, Willetton Primary School, for the invitation, for sharing your time and campus with us, for learning Indonesian dances and traditional musical instruments with us and for welcoming us so openly and warmly."



Meanwhile during their Indonesian lessons last week, the Year 3s had a go at playing Indonesian children's games and getting dressed up in traditional clothes.
